**Kel Kade** is the author of the King's Dark Tidings (KDT) series. She lives in Texas and occasionally serves as an adjunct college faculty member, inspiring young minds and introducing them to the fascinating and very real world of geosciences. Thanks to Kade's enthusiastic readers and the success of the King's Dark Tiding series, Kade is now able to create universes spanning space and time, develop criminal empires, plot the downfall of tyrannous rules and dive into fantastical mysteries full time.



**Ruby Amanfu** is a Ghana-born and Nashville-raised vocalist, songwriter and cook. Her accolades include co-writing the Top 40 radio single, "Hard Place," by multi-Grammy-winning artist H.E.R., appearing on Beyonce's hit song, "Don't Hurt Yourself," and being Jack White's bandmate for two years. Ruby has released 9 critically-acclaimed solo albums and a 3-album release, The Collections. An ambassador and model for Reese Witherspoon's Draper James line of clothing and accessories, Ruby has co-starring roles on CMT's "Nashville" and is an elected Grammy Board Governor. She is founder of the multi-sensory experience, Supper & Serenade.



**Sam Ashworth**, a singer/songwriter and producer, has spent the last 20 years building a genredefying career. At age 16, he wrote a song recorded by Sixpence None The Richer on their self-titled platinum album. At 23, Sam produced songs for CCM legend Michael W. Smith which earned him a Grammy nomination. As a singer-songwriter, Ashworth has released four projects of his own. He co-wrote and sang the Dutch Top 40 dance smash "Million Times." Sam co-wrote 9 songs on Grammy-winning artist H.E.R.'s latest album, including the Top 40 single "Hard Place."



Alice Randall is a screenwriter, lyricist, and *New York Times* bestselling author. Her first screenplay was a long-form video for Reba McEntire which became ACM video of the year. She has sold screenplays to Paramount, Warner Bros, HBO, Harpo, Quincy Jones Entertainment, BET, and more. Movies on which she has worked include *Boomerang, Their Eyes Were Watching God,* and *XXX's and OOO's* for which she co-wrote the screenplay and the theme song - which became a #1 country hit for Trisha Yearwood. Randall began screenwriting/producing after a successful run as a country songwriter and song publisher. She has over 30 cuts, including

songs recorded by Trisha Yearwood, Glen Campbell and Steve Earle. Her fifth novel is forthcoming from HarperCollins. Her first novel, *The Wind Done Gone*, is a *New York Times* bestseller
